This year's High Holy
Day experience will be different
than those we have experienced
in previous years. However, this
does not mean that they will be
any less meaningful or beautiful.
Cantor Jake and I have been
working diligently to provide an
experience that will approximate
much of what you have come to
expect of a Temple Sinai High
Holy Day worship experience, yet
in a safe, virtual setting.

When we get closer to Erev Rosh Hashanah, you will receive a YouTube link for each of our services. You will access these much as you have accessed the Friday night services during our time of physical distancing. They will also be accessed via our Temple Sinai YouTube channel. If you are subscribed, you will be able to click on these directly in the YouTube site. These can be viewed either at the time those links "go live," or any time thereafter. However, these are not opportunities for live chatting with other congregants or with me.

To provide a live worship experience, as well as for member interaction, my family and I will be hosting a Rosh Hashanah seder.

What is a Rosh Hashanah seder?

The word "seder" means "order." Similar to a Pesach seder, a Rosh Hashanah seder includes four cups of wine or grape juice, and prayers around particular symbolic food items.

What do I need to prepare to join this seder?

As for other holidays, you will need Holiday/Shabbat candles, wine or grape juice for kiddush, a kiddush cup (wine glass is fine), and challah. Traditionally, the challah for Rosh Hashanah is round to symbolize the circle of the year beginning again.

In addition, if you would like to be a full participant in the seder experience, please have on hand the following fruits or foods: sliced apple and honey, dates, a pomegranate, string beans, a pumpkin or gourd, spinach leaves, leeks or scallions, and a head of lettuce. Also include a new fruit that you have not yet eaten this season.

If you are unable to secure these foods, please feel free to join us anyway. I will have these symbolic foods at my table where you can see them and say the blessings over them.

Any blessings we will say will be provided on screen, so you do not need a Haggadah or prayer book.

When will this seder occur?

The seder will begin on Erev Rosh Hashanah, Friday, September 18, 2020 at 5:30 pm. It will include time for us to schmooze both in the larger group as well as in smaller groups. We will finish by 6:30, when everyone will be able to eat dinner with their own families before the virtual Erev Rosh Hashanah service begins on YouTube at 8 pm.

How will we access the Erev RH seder?

As this will be an interactive event, you will receive a zoom link by email that you will click on to gain access to the seder at 5:30 pm.

May this New Year of 5781 be a sweet one for our community and for the world L'shanah Tovah U'metukah,

Shalom Friends,

We often wonder at how, with the building closed for gathering and people doing their best to stay healthy, there is so much good work done by our caring volunteers. They are shining lights! Let us be clear, there are MANY volunteers working on important programs for the Temple during this time, but in the spirit of acts of loving kindness and social justice we are focusing on specific programs at this time. Here are some examples:

The Ruth & Norman Rales Jacobson Food Pantry gave us 10 stand-up boxes to fill for their High Holy Days Food Drive. In this year of isolation, we wondered, if people would drive to Temple just to donate food. The Social Action Committee organized a drive-by Food Drive. To make it a safe experience, 9 volunteers stood in the heat on various days to collect bags of food. We filled more than 10 boxes with YOUR generosity.

And that was certainly not all! Members, **Norma and Marvin Ravikoff**, wanted this year's Food Drive to be extraordinary. They support organizations serving those in need and donated 6 FULL SUV'S of non-perishable food (see photo on next page.) It does our hearts good to know how much more will be on the shelves of the Jacobson Food Pantry through the efforts of Temple Sinai.

Another example of community volunteerism are **Andrea and Joe Goldberg**, who are early advocates of the "Reclaim Our Vote" campaign (organized by the non-partisan Center for Common Ground of Virginia). The campaign promotes voter empowerment and mobilization among voters in states experiencing high degrees of voter suppression. This project is endorsed by the Religious Action Center (RAC), the social justice arm of the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ). With their guidance, the strong team of volunteers including dozens of Temple members have been responsible for writing and mailing 10,000 + postcards! The postcard writing is now complete, but Andrea welcomes volunteers for other voter empowerment projects. She can be reached at (217)-778-0049. Perfect examples of loving kindness are the "Shalom Callers" who are in phone contact with every household of our congregation. SAVE ON TAXES?

You can avoid taxes and save money by having a distribution from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) sent directly to Temple Sinai. The donation can be used to pay dues, towards a temple project or as a general donation (this can be used by the Temple as needed). The funds must be sent as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). Contact us about your plans, then ask your IRA trustee or custodian how to proceed.

You can avoid capital gains taxes on appreciated shares of stock that you own by donating the shares to Temple Sinai. As above, the money can be used for any temple bill, project or as a general donation.

Contact us and we will give you instructions on what to tell your broker. After the shares are transferred to our account, we will sell them and credit your account for the net proceeds (after the fees and expenses are paid). If you have stock that you don't want to sell because of the taxes, this is a win/win for both you and Temple Sinai.

You should realize savings even if you don't itemize. If you do, it shouldn't count as income AND you should be able to take the deduction. As with any financial matter, you should consult your own financial representative or tax advisor to see if these techniques will benefit you.





THE CONSUMMATE CONSUMER HOW TO SELECT AN ATTORNEY OR CPA

What do an attorney and a Rabbi have in common? Ask 5 of either of them a question and you'll get 10 opinions. So, here's my opinion on selecting an attorney or CPA by using important selection criteria.

- 1. Years of Full Time Experience: Seek a very experienced attorney, with at least 10 full time years of experience. They have often done the exact job you need dozens of times. Would you rather be the 100th client with that need or the 5th?
- 2. Percentage of Professional Work in Your Needed Specialty Area: Many professionals spend all their time in one or two areas of work. Others are more general and spend maybe 10% of their time in ten different areas. Would you rather have a CPA with 10 years' experience during which 90% of his work was the exact type you need, or a CPA with 3 years' experience during which 90% of his work was a different type? Find someone who has spent at least 75% of his time during the past 10 years in your specialty area of need.
- 3. Right Sized Firm: If you are an individual seeking personal legal or accounting advice, which professional would be the "right sized" firm for you:
 - a) A sole practitioner or one with 1 or 2 partners?
 - b) A practitioner in a firm with 50 other professionals?
 - c) A practitioner in a world-wide firm with 120 offices in 80 countries?

The same question applies if you are the CEO of a local, South Florida business with headquarters here plus 3 other locations in South Florida and 80 employees and you want legal/accounting advice for your company. The question is the same but your answers should differ. Limit your search to firms big enough to do a good job, but small enough so that you are one of the firm's most important clients.

- 4. Who Does Your Work: What if your selection meets the first three criteria but the attorney who does your work just graduated, or has much less experience than the attorney you selected? Ask this question before selecting—Will your attorney/CPA do 100% of your work or 10% or some other small portion? Seek out a "WYSIWYG" attorney/CPA. "Who you see is who you get."
- 5. Scope of Work: Let's say you want an answer to one question from a lawyer and a one-page letter explaining his answer. Instead, what if his "office policy" is to:
 - a) Interview you for 2-4 hours to gather background.
 - b) Ask you to complete a multi-page questionnaire explaining your situation and what legal work you had performed previously.
 - c) Obtain from you a copy of your previous legal documents (whether or not you consider them relevant to your immediate question.)
 - d) Then provide you with a multi-page summary of his legal research and conclusions with a list of concerns about future changes? That would be a good time to seek a different lawyer, one who accommodates your needs instead of the other way around. That is why you must confirm the scope of work before you make your selection.



- 6. Red Flags: If a CPA's web site looks very polished and contains pages, but does not address the above criteria, that is a red flag! If an attorney on the phone "answers" your questions "politically correct" but without simple, direct, and brief facts, that is another red flag. If a staff person in the CPA's office says the CPA is tied up for several days and then says that he (the staff person) will answer your questions, that is a red flag. If you cannot talk to the professional before you hire him, will you ever be able to talk to that person? Remember the above: "Who Does Your Work?"
- 7. Always Compare and Have a Plan B: You should search for TWO lawyers or CPAs who meet your criteria. Then, prepare a chart or table to compare their status under your criteria. Put the comparison away for a day or two and review it again. Then, make your choice. This increases your chance of making a good choice. Also, it gives you an immediate Plan B if the first choice "disappears" or is not available when you call back. Otherwise, you have no fallback and are likely to do something you will regret.
- 8. A Word About Fees: If you pay too little, you may get too little. If you pay too much, you may just.....pay too much.....but are much more likely to get what you need. Would you rather get a "bargain" fee but not get the work result you need, or get the work you need but also get the feeling you "overpaid?" There's no magic way to know that the attorney's or CPA's fee is "just right." That's one benefit of comparing two or more professionals. Evaluate the fee alongside the other criteria.

An attorney and CPA enter a bar and go up to buy a drink. They discover the bartender is also a Rabbi. They put down Israeli shekels to pay for the drinks. But, the bartender/Rabbi says: "Sorry men, but only American dollars are accepted here. Otherwise, you don't have a prayer!"






