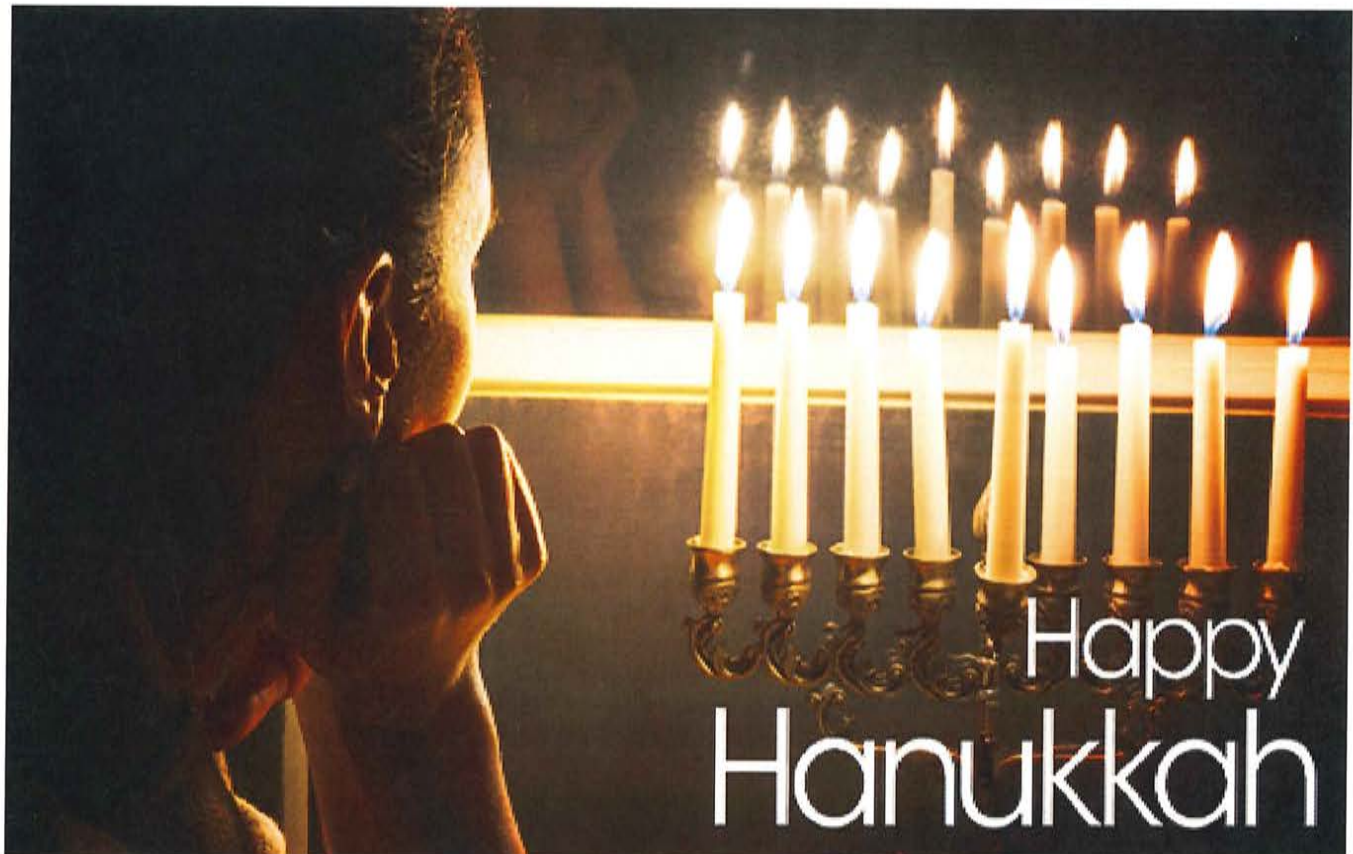

Hanukkah Blessings

Candles are added to the *hanukkiyah* (menorah) from right to left but are kindled from left to right. The newest candle is lit first. On the Shabbat of Hanukkah, kindle the Hanukkah lights first and then the Shabbat candles.

Light the *shamash* (the helper candle) first, using it to kindle the rest of the Hanukkah lights. As you do, say or sing:

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר קִדְּשָׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיו,
וְצִוָּנוּ לְהַדְלִיק נֵר שֶׁל חֲנֻכָּה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu l'hadlik ner shel Hanukkah.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who hallows us with mitzvot, commanding us to kindle the Hanukkah lights.

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, שֶׁעָשָׂה נִסִּים לְאַבוֹתֵינוּ
וְאִמּוֹתֵינוּ בַּיָּמִים הָהֵם בְּזֶמַן הַזֶּה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, she-asah nisim laavoteinu v'imoteinu bayamim hahaeim baz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who performed wondrous deeds for our ancestors in days of old at this season.

For first night only:

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, שֶׁהַחַיָּנוּ וְקִיָּמָנוּ
וְהַגִּיעָנוּ לַזֶּמַן הַזֶּה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, shehecheyanu v'kiy'manu v'higiyanu laz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who has kept us alive, sustained us, and brought us to this season.

THE CONSUMMATE CONSUMER™

WHY FAIRNESS MATTERS TO CONSUMERS

Is fairness dead? Probably, when you consider transactions consumers are forced into with outrageous “terms and conditions” buried in mouse print footnotes or web site agreements. Many wise folks view “business ethics” as an oxymoron. Fairness in business is countercultural. Examples are everywhere, such as these.

IS FAIRNESS DEAD? YOU BE THE JUDGE! CHECK ONE COLUMN PER QUESTION.	FAIR	UNFAIR
1. Mandatory one-sided arbitration clauses in which the employer, credit card bank or seller selects the arbitration location (a thousand miles from consumer’s location), the amount of arbitration fees (exceeding what the consumer would owe a lawyer in advance), the arbitration procedures (favoring employer) and the arbitrator’s identity (the same arbitrator always used by and paid by employer).		
2. Waivers of rights to litigate a claim, meaning consumers give up access to our court system. For example, a large national corporation offers a customer \$500 for her “embarrassment” as a result of falling on a wet floor in one of their stores. Before mailing her the check, they mail her a legal liability waiver (which, of course, they had never mentioned to her) to sign away her rights to damages for her possibly life-long back injury caused by their wet floor!		
3. Disclaimers of business liability. For example, a software vendor licenses a new software system to a customer’s business for \$800,000. Then, in fine print on page 35 of the 50-page standard contract, the vendor limits its liability for customer damages caused by software defects to \$1500. For a more common example, how many hundreds of times have you seen a business sign say “We are NOT RESPONSIBLE” for any damages? On the other hand, have you EVER seen a business sign say “We ARE RESPONSIBLE for damages and we WILL REIMBURSE you fairly and voluntarily without forcing you to sue us or to negotiate with our insurance company lawyers”?		
4. Outrageous credit card interest rates, far exceeding by triple or more the state usury laws.		
5. Standard seller contracts that deny all consumer legal rights and all fair terms that the “weaker” consumer would be able to claim. For one of hundreds of examples, in standard office and retail leases the landlord has 99% of the rights and the tenant has 99% of the obligations.		
6. A theater offers season tickets with a 100% refund for cancelled shows. If you read the fine print, you learn that the refund only applies if the theater cancels a show not if you cancel, and only if the theater cancels due to the pandemic. Suddenly, 100% equals zero.		
7. You pay \$1000 as a cruise deposit for your spouse and 8 other family members. The cruise line cancels the cruise. They promise a 100% credit for 18 months. Weeks later you learn that the 100% only applies if ALL	,

THE SAME ten people from the original cruise take the second cruise, even though you personally paid 100% of the deposit. So, if you and your spouse are the only passengers on the second cruise because the other eight relatives cannot make it, then suddenly 100% equals 20%.		
8. Workers are misclassified as independent contractors instead of employees, although they work alongside employees essentially without differences. Those workers are denied health insurance, paid vacation, sick leave, bonuses, and retirement plans, and must pay the employer's half of Social Security taxes, doubling the amount paid by workers.		
9. Consumers are stuck with warranties for products and services that actually <i>reduce or eliminate warranties</i> available by law. In other words, the seller grants a useless "warranty" then says it is "exclusive" so the consumer cannot take advantage of broader warranties legally available.		
10. Sellers require contracts containing one-way termination provisions granting them broad termination rights far beyond what the consumer expects but denying all or nearly all termination rights to the consumer.		

WHY FAIRNESS MATTERS

Fairness matters because.....we should want to live in a society that is not ruled by the "gotcha" culture of "Buyer Beware".

Fairness matters because.....we should want to live in a society in which people dealing with consumers treat them as they would want to be treated when they are consumers. Have you heard of "The Golden Rule"?

Fairness matters because.....we should want to behave in consumer transactions in ways we would be proud to describe fully to our children and grandchildren. Which of the above examples would you be proud to defend to your children or grandchildren?

Fairness matters for those reasons and more. If you agree, do what you can in your own dealings to be fair to people who buy goods or services from you.

Educate your kids and grandkids about the importance of fairness and its absence from their daily dealings. Teach them that the golden rule should apply.....do unto others as you would have them do unto you.

Do not ask others to give up access to courts if you would not want others to ask you to do the same thing. *Do not ask* others to pay 25% interest if you would refuse to pay 25% interest to others. Let's replace "Buyer Beware" with "Seller Be Fair". *Do the right thing. Fairness matters.*

SAVE ON TAXES?

You can **avoid taxes and save money** by having a distribution from your Individual Retirement Account (**IRA**) sent directly to Temple Sinai. The donation can be used to pay dues, towards a temple project or as a general donation (this can be used by the Temple as needed). The funds must be sent as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (**QCD**). **Contact us** about your plans, then ask your IRA trustee or custodian how to proceed.

You can **avoid capital gains taxes** on appreciated shares of stock that you own by donating the shares to Temple Sinai. As above, the money can be used for any temple bill, project or as a general donation.

Contact us and we will give you instructions on what to tell your broker. After the shares are transferred to our account, we will sell them and credit your account for the net proceeds (after the fees and expenses are paid). If you have stock that you don't want to sell because of the taxes, this is a win/win for both you and Temple Sinai.

You should realize savings even if you don't itemize. *If you do, it shouldn't count as income AND you should be able to take the deduction.* As with any financial matter, you should consult your own financial representative or tax advisor to see if these techniques will benefit you.

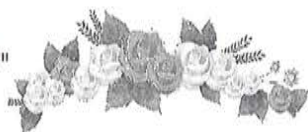


