Happy 2021! While it has been 5781 on our Hebrew calendar for a few months now, I think our communal consciousness is shifting with the change of the secular calendar after the horrible year we have just experienced. I think we all will be glad when we can view 2020 in our rearview mirror. It gives new meaning to the saying, "Hindsight is 2020!"

This secular year, I have as a goal for our congregation to continue to remain strong and tighter than ever before. One of the gifts that we can say has come from our reliance on virtual communal gathering online is that we can get to know one another in new and different groupings in various social circles. During this pandemic, we have already begun many new social opportunities. For instance, a new caring community program began as an outgrowth of the desire to stay in touch with and to provide

hope to all in our congregation. Volunteers each have a list of about 20 people to call regularly on the phone to check in on how they are doing. I hope that you are familiar with that program and have had conversations with the volunteer assigned to you. We have created opportunities for all the members assigned to a particular volunteer to gather virtually to get to know one another. Additionally, several social/game nights have been offered on Thursday evenings, which have proven successful. In addition to these opportunities, Jake Harris, our Cantorial Soloist is hosting "Jakey Live," and I will continue recording videos with my husband Scott Solkoff to be posted regularly on our Temple Sinai YouTube channel (please subscribe!)

questions or ideas. (Make sure you include the "b" after rabbiaviva in that email address!) Please write "Ask the rabbi" in the subject line of your email. I cannot promise that I will respond to all of these, but I will try to do so over the course of the next several months.

As we begin 2021, I would like to express my gratitude to all of you who have stuck with Temple Sinai through this difficult time in our lives and our world. None of us could have foreseen what has occurred this year with the global pandemic, social distancing, and virtualonly gatherings. However, our congregation has remained strong. In some ways, our community has become stronger than ever, in terms of the closeness of our relationships. You are what has made this all possible. We have all proven that Temple Sinai is not the building--the people in our synagogue make us who we are: a warm, close-knit community that is truly a home. 



THE CONSUMMATE CONSUMER™ HOW TO AVOID CONSUMER DISPUTES BY: JOSEPH GREIF, JD, CPA

Maybe you shouldn't read this. After all, there are many types of consumers. Not all of you want to avoid disputes. Some of you may relish chances to tangle online or by phone with company reps far away who answer your questions by reading "canned answers" from their screens. It that describes you, turn the page.

On the other hand, if you would rather have a root canal than spend another hour on the phone with "customer service", read on. You can avoid most of those torturous sessions by implementing the "lessons learned" below.

LESSONS LEARNED FROM CONSUMER DISPUTES

- 1. ONLINE PRODUCTS THAT DO NOT WORK: Do not buy products online if they are things that "may not work". Instead buy that type of product at a store where you are sure in advance that you can return it "no questions asked" if it does not work. Online purchases that "do not work" may leave you stranded between the seller who never actually promised it would work and your credit card company that claims it only protects you against "billing errors" not "nonworking product" disputes.
- 2. PREPAYMENTS: Do not prepay for services or memberships or classes. Instead, "pay as you go". The seller may keep your money if you are unable to obtain all the services or enjoy the membership for the full term or attend all the classes. The seller may insist it has a "no refund" policy, which is buried in mouse print of "terms and conditions" you "signed" when you "initialed" a box on their computer screen.
- 3. REFUND PROMISES: Do not rely on web sites promising "100% refund if you are not satisfied". That is often only an unenforceable marketing technique. If a refund is important to you, go to the store you know that has ALWAYS refunded your money before and buy the item there.
- 4. AUTOMATIC RENEWALS: Do not purchase anything with an "automatic renewal" feature. This is common for subscriptions and memberships of all kinds. Often, the automatic renewal is buried in mouse print of "terms and conditions" you "signed" when you "initialed" a box on a computer screen. The automatic renewal may lead to months and months of fees for services you no longer want but cannot avoid once the company has your credit card or bank account data.
- 5. ASTERISKS AND MOUSE PRINT RED FLAGS: Do not purchase products sold from ads with multiple asterisks or lines of mouse print. The purpose of the asterisks and the mouse print is to "disclose" that the product is NOT what you expect based on the ad.
- 6. PURCHASES FROM UNKNOWN COMPANIES: Do not buy products online from a company you do not know. The "company" may be two guys in a basement in Newark or some students in a small town in Asia with a name you cannot pronounce and a true address you will never locate.
- 7. NONREFUNDABLE DEPOSITS: Do not make purchases requiring nonrefundable deposits unless you are prepared to forever "kiss that money goodbye". Those companies know that many circumstances can arise that would make you seek a refund. The seller may not care if the circumstance is beyond your control (like a hurricane or a death in the family). If you cannot afford to lose the money, do not make the deposit.
- 8. TRAVEL INSURANCE ILLUSIONS: Do not rely on being saved from a disaster by purchasing "travel insurance". The marketed policy may have more exclusions than the number of holes in a

- slice of Swiss cheese. The one exception is the "loss for any reason" policy. However, that costs a whole lot more and even that policy may not cover "any reason" (such as a loss triggered by a pandemic).
- 9. WARRANTIES: Do not rely on so-called warranties offered with products. Most consumer warranties are not worth the paper on which they are written. Instead, they accomplish the opposite by expressly superseding broader warranties available to you by law and replacing them with extremely limited warranties from which few consumers will ever benefit. Worse yet, the offered warranty may include waivers of liability and the right to sue, which reduce your rights.
- 10. CREDIT CARD BANK DISPUTE RESOLUTION: Do not rely on the dispute resolution department of your credit card company. The company will not give you its written dispute resolution policy stating your rights to a credit to your account when a purchase fails, because there is no written policy. Filing a claim with the company may help but you are at its mercy.
- 11. FATAL EMOTIONAL COMMITMENTS: Do not get "emotionally committed" to a specific purchase, product, company or service. Once you cross that line, you can kiss these lessons learned goodbye. Mistakes will pile on top of mistakes. You will have lost the dispute before it ever arose. You might as well give the company your checkbook and credit cards and say "thanks for the memories".
- 12. CONSUMER REPORTS IS YOUR FRIEND: Rely on Consumer Reports publications. They do not guarantee your happiness but they do substantially reduce your risk of errors that lead to unhappiness and unresolved disputes.

You do not have to suffer with endless hours of "customer service" calls. Just implement these lessons learned. Maybe you will enjoy life more.

SAVE ON TAXES?

You can avoid taxes and save money by having a distribution from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) sent directly to Temple Sinai. The donation can be used to pay dues, towards a temple project or as a general donation (this can be used by the Temple as needed). The funds must be sent as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). Contact us about your plans, then ask your IRA trustee or custodian how to proceed.

You can **avoid capital gains** taxes on appreciated shares of stock that you own by donating the shares to Temple Sinai. As above, the money can be used for any temple bill, project or as a general donation.

Contact us and we will give you instructions on what to tell your broker. After the shares are transferred to our account, we will sell them and credit your account for the net proceeds (after the fees and expenses are paid). If you have stock that you don't want to sell because of the taxes, this is a win/win for both you and Temple Sinai.

You should realize savings even if you don't itemize. If you do, it shouldn't count as income AND you should be able to take the deduction. As with any financial matter, you should consult your own financial representative or tax advisor to see if these techniques will benefit you.




