## rabbi's corner

As I write this article, we are getting ready for Pesach and virtual seders yet again around the country. We never thought last year that we would need to prepare for another virtual seder. However, this year, many of us have a better idea about when we can return to some of our activities, like visiting with small groups of family and friends, when all have been vaccinated. Suddenly, we are counting the days until we finally can feel some emotional relief and change coming. If we had a first vaccine, we have been counting 21 or 28 days until the second. If we have had the second vaccine, we are counting 2 weeks until we have reached safe immunity from severe illness if we contract COVID.

In our Jewish calendar,

we are also beginning a count, the Omer period. Beginning the second night of Pesach (Day One), we count for seven weeks of seven days, 49 days to the agricultural harvest holiday of Shavuot. Yet unlike counting down to a given positive event in our lives, like a vacation, we count upwards. Every night, we say a bracha, a blessing, and we count that night's count. The Fiftieth Day is Shavuot, the agricultural festival on which we also celebrate the Receiving of the Torah at Sinai. Thus, we count, ever higher and higher to climb from Exodus to Revelation.

Often in our lives, we need to be able to count toward something positive that we are anticipating to occur. This very act of counting propels us forward. Especially in times of darkness, we need to be able to count toward and count on a time of the light. For a full year, we could not

count on anything, because we did not know when we would have a vaccine or when it would become distributed. The ability to see the light at the end of the tunnel is what gives us hope.

As we count upward toward Shavuot, may we all feel a renewed sense of hope, joy, and abundant blessing. And may this renewed hope enable us to ready ourselves, once again, to receive the Torah that is meant for each of us.

Dearest Friends,

In the last few weeks, we passed the year milestone of the temple transitioning to virtual services. A tougher anniversary than most, the day was given another meaning with the release of our virtual Gala "For The Love of Sinai." I was so ecstatic to be a part of the team to make the Gala happen, as well as being an honoree. As I picked up my Gala box from the temple, I saw the whole year flash before my eyes. I remembered when Mark, our temple administrator, brought a podium to my house so that Rabbi Aviva and I could lead the first virtual service. After the initial services, in our own homes, we raised the camera angles up and realized that we didn't even need the podiums!

In fact, after a while, I even stopped wearing shoes during services. I thought this would be somewhat sacrilegious, until I read in the Torah when God told Moses to remove his sandals when he approached the burning bush, as the ground he stood on was holy. My one-bedroom Delray apartment, while not as holy as the wilderness where Moses came across the burning bush, gained new magic. It had nothing to do with the location, but rather, the change of intention. My home was no longer just a residence but a conduit to prayer for the community. My internet became a lifeline to deliver the prayers to the people, while also connecting with Rabbi Aviva. The idea of

escaping technology on Shabbat was so unrealistic that even some orthodox communities relaxed their rules. When the world changes so quickly and drastically, it seems impractical to try and keep up the same traditions and rituals we involved ourselves in before the change. On the other hand, if we didn't keep up with our traditions even during times of separation, would our culture have survived this far? It is a valid argument either way. No matter what, as our world starts to open back up, I will always be grateful to have gone through this year with such a wonderful community.

# THE CONSUMMATE CONSUMER™

## BETTER HEALTH CARE FOR CONSUMERS

Good health insurance requires prioritizing consumers over corporate profits. Public health plans can do that. Private health plans cannot. Before you are eligible for Medicare, you have no choice. If you are Medicare eligible and adopt traditional, government-insured Medicare, you have many fewer problems. But even then, you may have a Part D prescription plan and a Medicare Supplement Plan, both of which are PRIVATE insurance. The same is true of Medicare “Advantage” plans. More private insurance. So just about everyone has private insurance problems. Here are some reforms that would reduce those problems.

### 1. GIVE US INSURANCE, NOT “MANAGED/LESS CARE”

Insurance and managed care are not the same. Health insurance is coverage promised by a written policy. It is sometimes called indemnity insurance. The carrier indemnifies the patient for costs of benefits promised by a written policy. Administrative intervention to “determine” what the policy includes is not needed.

Managed care is the antithesis of insurance, just a *pseudonym* for LESS care and LOWER insurer costs. Managed/Less care---not insurance---is what we have now. No longer can a patient look at his policy in advance to determine whether specific benefits are covered.

### 2. REPLACE “GET MEDICAL CARE NOW, FIND OUT IF YOU’RE COVERED LATER” WITH PRE-CARE COVERAGE

Even if we retain Managed/Less Care rather than return to Real Insurance, we need to know whether we are covered in advance. Under Managed/Less Care and Medicare, we can usually obtain the insurer’s coverage determination letter—assuring us of coverage for our costs---only after we incur those costs, possibly thousands of dollars. What good is that?

### 3. MAKE MEDICARE A 100% GOVERNMENT PLAN

Most consumers not yet old enough for Medicare believe that when they are old enough they will be covered for their Medicare benefits *by the federal government*. Are they in for a rude surprise! The federal government only offers Parts A and B of Medicare. If you want drug coverage, that is Part D. You must buy it from corporations. And, if you want a Medicare Supplement policy (because—*another age 65 surprise*--Parts A and B are not comprehensive), you must buy that from corporations. Since private insurance is 100% private, public insurance should be 100% public.

### 4. CREATE A PATIENT PROTECTION AGENCY

Consumers need a Patient Protection Agency. Patients have nowhere to turn when faced with insurance problems. Corporations must maximize shareholder value and executive compensation. They have no obligation to maximize patient rights, benefits, and coverage while minimizing patient costs. Patients need an advocate.

### 5. REPLACE PRIVATE MONOPOLY WITH REAL COMPETITION FROM PUBLIC OPTION

Consumers ineligible for Medicare need competition for private insurers. Sometimes, when employers are asked why they do not switch to better plans than the one offered by their current private carrier, they reply with reasons that begin: “Because this carrier is the *only one* that. .... (fill in the blank here). ....” They say that corporations divide up markets to minimize competition. The closer you look, the less competition you find. What will change that? *Only real competition from a public option.*

## 6. REQUIRE SIMPLE ENGLISH, REASONABLE-LENGTH, INSURANCE POLICIES

The return to reliance on written insurance policies that define coverage in advance, instead of ad-hoc bureaucratic after-the-fact Managed/Less Care denials, will bring consumers limited help unless accompanied by understandable, easy-to-read concise insurance policies. An old Wall Street Journal article cited one policy that was 76 pages long and another that was 59 pages long. Who does that serve? Certainly not consumers.

## 7. PROHIBIT CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Consumers need freedom from hidden conflicts of interest. Decades ago, Congress made it illegal for hospitals to pay doctors for sending them patients. So, what could hospitals do? Simple. If they could not “buy” patients, then they could just “buy” doctors whose patients would “come along”.

Prohibit hospitals from avoiding taboos on buying patients by making doctors employees in order to “get” their patients. Prohibit hospitals from taking money from drug, medical equipment, and other health care corporations, money that may influence hospital choices on which drugs and equipment to use for patients.

## 8. PROHIBIT CLAIMS QUOTAS AND CLAIMS DENIAL INCENTIVES

Consumers need fairness. Corporations sometimes have quotas for how many, or what percentage, of patient claims they will approve, to meet profit goals. Even John Grisham wrote a fictionalized—but fact-based--version of this practice in one of his bestsellers.

## 9. REJECT CORPORATE PROMISES ACCOMPANIED BY UNSPOKEN, UNLIMITED ADDED COSTS

Consumers need premium increase caps. Corporations make promises of things they would do if Congress would leave them alone. However, sometimes, you have to focus not just on promises made but on what is left unsaid. For example, corporations may allow more group policyholders to convert to individual policies than before. So what? When conversions are allowed, *premium increases are unlimited*. People might move from one state to another and try to convert their policy from the former state to the new state. But, their premium could increase from \$5000 to \$25000 annually. If so, the right to convert is illusory. Similarly, corporations may promise to cover pre-existing conditions. But with unlimited premium increases?

## SUMMARY

**Consumers need consumer-focused choices.** If these problems bother you, request your Congressional representatives in the House and Senate to fix them. They will be considering reforms during the next few years. You might as well get your concerns addressed.

## SAVE ON TAXES?

You can **avoid taxes and save money** by having a distribution from your Individual Retirement Account (**IRA**) sent directly to Temple Sinai. The donation can be used to pay dues, towards a temple project or as a general donation (this can be used by the Temple as needed). The funds must be sent as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (**QCD**). **Contact us** about your plans, then ask your IRA trustee or custodian how to proceed.

You can **avoid capital gains** taxes on appreciated shares of stock that you own by donating the shares to Temple Sinai. As above, the money can be used for any temple bill, project or as a general donation.

**Contact us** and we will give you instructions on what to tell your broker. After the shares are transferred to our account, we will sell them and credit your account for the net proceeds (after the fees and expenses are paid). If you have stock that you don't want to sell because of the taxes, this is a win/win for both you and Temple Sinai.

You should realize savings even if you don't itemize. *If you do, it shouldn't count as income AND you should be able to take the deduction.* As with any financial matter, you should consult your own financial representative or tax advisor to see if these techniques will benefit you.




