

rabbi's corner

With the fall schedule of chagim now completed, most of us turn to other secular holidays as we start to see more candy on the supermarket shelves and costume shops opening. We may begin to think about Thanksgiving meals as pumpkin patches open.

Yet are the secular celebrations of Halloween and Thanksgiving "kosher" for American Jews to celebrate? Why or why not? What do most Reform rabbis say about these holidays?

Most scholars believe that Halloween is derived from an ancient Celtic pagan celebration called Samhain which celebrated the end of the harvest and the beginning of the darker winter months. It was believed that at this time, the boundary between the living and the dead was thinner, enabling spirits to enter the homes of the living. The souls of the dead were thought to come to seek hospitality.

Rituals of the occult were observed like divination, trying

to see the future, appeasing the spirit world, and warding off demons. By the 18th Century, imitating the evil spirits led to a tradition of wearing costumes and playing pranks on others. By the 20th Century, these practices had spread to England.

Christianity also played a role in the development of the holiday we now know as Halloween. In the 9th Century, Pope Gregory IV decided to place the Christian holiday of All Hallows' Day on the same date of Samhain, the 1st of November.

In America, it was not until the mid-19th Century that Halloween became widely celebrated with the mass immigration to the United States from Ireland and Scotland at that time. By the first few decades of the 20th Century, Halloween had gained popularity and was celebrated as a secular children's costume-wearing holiday of trick-or- treating and collecting and eating candy.

Today, some Christians worldwide still observe All Hallows' Day or, in the Lutheran calendar, Reformation Day. Others believe that Halloween celebrates the occult and should be avoided altogether for that reason.

Because of its origins, some Jews believe we should not celebrate Halloween. Most Reform Jews argue that Halloween has become so divorced from its Christian (and earlier pagan) origins that it is a fully secular holiday, acceptable to be celebrated as a fun day of costumes and candy, especially by children.

As a Reform rabbi, I do not believe that celebrating this secular holiday does any harm to us as Jews. My own family has chosen to dress up in costumes and trick-or-treat since my sons were young. Halloween today is a time of fun, family, and community celebrations.

As to Thanksgiving, we are much more homogeneous in our beliefs, as Jews of all denominations celebrate this Fall celebration of gratitude for the harvest. This year, there is actually a Jewish holiday to celebrate on Thanksgiving as well, since Hanukkah begins the same weekend!



SAVE ON TAXES?

You can avoid taxes and save money by having a distribution from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) sent directly to Temple Sinai. The donation can be used to pay dues, towards a temple project or as a general donation (this can be used by the Temple as needed). The funds must be sent as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (OCD). Contact us about your plans, then ask your IRA trustee or custodian how to proceed.

You can avoid capital gains taxes on appreciated shares of stock that you own by donating the shares to Temple Sinai. As above, the money can be used for any temple bill, project or as a general donation.

Contact us and we will give you instructions on what to tell your broker. After the shares are transferred to our account, we will sell them and credit your account for the net proceeds (after the fees and expenses are paid). If you have stock that you don't want to sell because of the taxes, this is a win/win for both you and Temple Sinai.

You should realize savings even if you don't itemize. If you do, it shouldn't count as income AND you should be able to take the deduction. As with any financial matter, you should consult your own financial representative or tax advisor to see if these techniques will benefit you.




